CHURCH COUNCIL NEWS

Church Council Minutes - May 19, 2009

Pastors Report: The confirmation service was well run and organized. Pastor attended the Baccalaureate service at the high school. He had suggestions for improvement; among the suggestions was Joy's increased participation in the future. The balance of the interim schedule was discussed since we have extended a call for a new Pastor. He will be flexible and ready to help in any way he can.

The Council reviewed the goals established at the retreat. Progress is being made but some areas are ahead of others. A request for Church use was tabled until more information could be obtained.

The treasurer's report was reviewed and approved. We are holding our own but must realize we will incur additional expenses to get the new Pastor in place. A new accounting program is currently being installed.

Committee topics: Outreach: Kim Regenhard has agreed to take over the committee through the balance of the year. The stewardship committee reported a disappointing response to the Time and Talent information request. More work will be done to get additional information. The Youth Committee will be holding a pizza party to survey the interest of our young people in a variety of church activities. We will also establish a child safety policy. The property and grounds committee reported the Spring Cleanup was a success. The sign in the front of the church was under repair. The council will review emergency preparedness and liability issues shortly. The JW/ELCA had over 100 participants for the mother daughter friend banquet.

New business: Joy will host the bloodmobile's visit to Prescott in December. We will form a mutual ministry committee to acclimate the new pastor to Prescott and the new job. An intentional transition program is recommended by the Synod to help new pastors. A vote on adopting the program and its costs was tabled until next meeting to do further research. The minutes from the most recent congregational meeting were approved.

Call Process Update

Thank you to all of our church members who attended the Congregational Meeting on May 10 to hear about the pastor the Call Committee was recommending to be Joy's next pastor and to vote on extending a Call to the Ministry of Word and Sacrament to Pastor Amy Fondroy Eich. We were pleased to have 145 voting members in attendance at this significant congregational meeting. Thank you for attending this special meeting and exercising your responsibility to listen, consider, and vote.

The results of the vote to call Pastor Fondroy Eich to Joy Lutheran Church were as follows:

Total Votes Cast	145
Number of "Yes" Votes Cast	119 (82%)
Number of "No" Votes Cast	19 (13%)
Number of "Abstaining" Votes Cast	7 (5%)

The vote was in the affirmative since, by our constitution, 66 2/3% yes votes is required to extend a Call to a pastor.

Following the meeting, the Letter of Call was signed by the congregational president and secretary and forwarded to the Bishop of the Northwest Wisconsin Synod, Bishop Duane Pedersen, for his signature. Information regarding the pastor's compensation and benefits package, which was approved at the congregational meeting, was also sent to the Synod Office. The Synod Office then sent the Letter of Call along with the other approved information to Pastor Fondroy Eich. ~We have received word from Pastor Fondroy Eich that she is accepting the call to come to Joy to be our next pastor.

Pastor Fondroy Eich will be installed as our pastor at Sunday morning services on August 2 at both services. The installation service will be conducted by Pastor Amy Odgren, Assistant to the Bishop of our Synod. This will be a special day in our congregation and we hope that everyone will plan to worship that Sunday and be witnesses to Pastor Fondroy Eich's installation as our pastor.

Prior to the Service of Installation in August, the Church Council is planning to host a "Meet and Greet" opportunity for our members to meet Pastor Amy and her husband, Pat, and children, Alexander and Deitrich. This will take place on Sunday, June 28th at both services, between services, and from 11:00 am—12:30 p.m. Mark your calendars now and plan to attend this special opportunity to meet Pastor Amy and her family.

This is an exciting time in our church, as we prepare to welcome a new pastor to work with us to build up our ministries as we follow God's call to spread the Good News to all people. Please continue to pray for the Holy Spirit's guidance for Pastor Amy and for all of us as we seek to faithfully serve our Risen Lord.

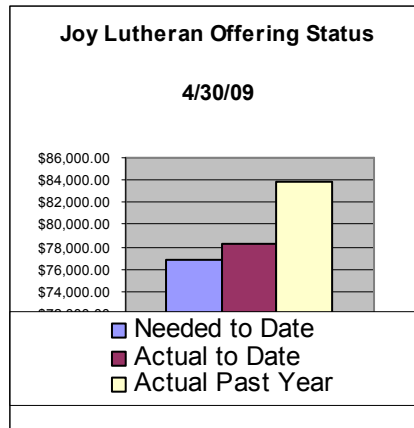
DEBT REDUCTION AND GENERAL FUND DRIVE

Even though the original “Growing with Joy” 3-year building fund drive will be completed at the end of 2009, we continue to have significant debt remaining. With this in mind, the Stewardship Committee has been investigating methods to continue to reduce our building debt and also increase our general fund and benevolence giving. We have reviewed two outside programs and have even considered managing the program internally. After detailed consideration and prayer, we have decided to utilize the ELCA Stewardship Key Leader Program. This program includes the following key elements:

- ✦ Stewardship key Leader program is a service of the ELCA that has been successful for 25 years and over 500 congregations.
- ✦ Provides the resources and leadership that enables local leaders to implement the plan tailored to their particular situation.
- ✦ Includes two on-site visits, five weeks apart. The first weekend is for planning and training introducing tried and tested materials and developing a timeline. The second weekend is for receiving commitments, planning the next steps and directing the follow up. Both weekends will include a Key Leader sermon on Sunday.
- ✦ Congregation members will receive two mailings prepared by the Key Leader.
- ✦ Prayer and Biblical reflection are central to the program. Several talks by key leaders will focus on biblical stewardship.
- ✦ Cost is dependent on the size of the congregation and is significantly lower than comparable programs by private firms outside the synod.

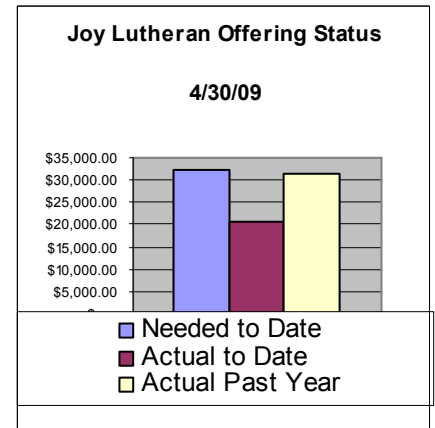
The Stewardship committee has also interviewed the representative that would be working with us and done background work to check references on the work of the program. Hope Lutheran Church in River Falls utilized this program and was very pleased with their work and the results. You will be hearing more about this as the year progresses. 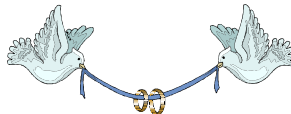
